





During the application process, participants are assessed and short term and long-term goals are established. A mentor team is assigned to the participant and a plan to reach goals is formulated. The 10-week CWJCGC program may be in addition to other outside resources (i.e. GED classes) that may be secured for the participant. The participant begins to experience the joy of having some control over the course that her life takes right from the start in this program.

- Complete job-readiness and life-skills program(s), then celebrate!
- Fulfill the CWJC purpose, then celebrate!
- Give back to the CWJCGC program, then celebrate!

# An Amazing Story of God's Amazing Grace

### Dawn Smith Jordan

The marvelous thing about God is that the deeper the tragedy, the greater the grace. Dawn Smith Jordan is no stranger to both. On May 31,1985, Dawn's younger sister, Shari, was kidnapped and murdered just two days before her high school graduation. It became the largest manhunt in South Carolina's history, drawing national attention.

Shari's murderer allowed her to write a letter of farewell to her family, saying: "Please don't let this ruin your lives. Just keep living one day at a time for Jesus. Remember, everything works out for the good to those that love the Lord. Some good will come of this." Never could Dawn or her family have realized how even God could do just that.

With the hope only found in Jesus Christ, Dawn went on to become Miss South Carolina 1986 and 2<sup>nd</sup> runner-up to Miss America. The Billy Graham Crusade came to South Carolina that same year, and millions were touched by Dawn's testimony, and her singing of "Amazing Grace." God was weaving all of these circumstances together to form a full-time ministry that would reach thousands throughout the U.S. and Canada.

Today, Dawn ministers in up to 75 concerts/events annually. The heartbeat of her music and message is the sufficiency of God's grace, even to the point of forgiving the man who killed her sister.

Dawn has a heart for the hurting, and a word of hope. Her story has ministered to countless numbers through her book <u>Grace So Amazing</u> (Crossway Books 1993), the CBS made-for-TV feature film "Nightmare in Columbia County" (1991) which continues to air both nationally and internationally. She is also published in <u>Lamp Unto My Feet</u> (Harper-Collins 1997, a verse-a-day devotional by 365 Christian leaders). With eight albums to her credit, her more recent recordings include "How Far" (1993), "Canopy" (1996), "Grace Still Amazing" (1998), "A Moment Alone" (2000), and her 2002 release "Everyday Praise". (All on Urgent Records.)

Dawn continues to walk in the grace of which she sings and speaks. In 1997, due to circumstances not of her own choosing, Dawn became a single mother. From the pit of despair came a deeper trust in the Lord and a new ministry to those facing the same situation. Forgiveness once again played a vital role in Dawn's ability to find healing and hope.

Dawn bas also appeared on the ACTS Network, In Touch Ministries with Dr. Charles Stanley, the 700 Club, and Christian Cable Video networks and Contemporary Christian radio stations nationwide. She also performed with Pope John Paul II during his SC appearance, and continues to be seen on the Billy Graham Classics telecasts. In addition, she has had the privilege of opening for other Christian artists including Larnelle Harris, New Song, The Imperials, Phillips, Craig and Dean, First Call, Billy Crockett and Babbie Mason. She performed the duet, "I've Just Seen Jesus" live with Larnelle Harris, and the charting duet, "Promise of Love", with Jerome Olds on her 1996 album, "Canopy." The music video of the same aired nationally.

As a vocalist/worship leader at women's ministry events, Dawn bas shared the platform with many of today's leading speakers, including Beth Moore, Becky Tirabassi, Kay Arthur, Marge Caldwell, Jeannette Clift George, Dorie Van Stone, Anne Graham Lotz and Patsy Clairmont.

As a part of the promotion for the movie based on Dawn's life story, Dawn appeared on the Maury Povich Show, as well as sharing her music ministry at the conclusion of the movie with a concert clip of the song she wrote in Shari's memory, "Sister." Her story also appeared in the February, 1989 issue of Reader's Digest, as well as numerous other Christian publications, and she recently reappeared on the 700 Club, and shared her story of forgiveness on American Journal. In October of 1999, her story was featured on "The FBI Files" on the Discovery Network.

Her song, "How Far", came out of the work God did in Dawn's life, bringing her to the point of forgiving her sister's murderer. Through song and testimony, Dawn's story of the sufficiency of God's grace and forgiveness has been used by God to minister to thousands for over a decade.

Dawn's first calling to ministry is to her family, raising them in the nurture and admonition of the Lord. Dawn resides with her children, Hannah (13) and Ross (10), in Columbia, South Carolina. They are active members of First Baptist Church of Columbia, SC.
