During the application process, participants are assessed and short term and long-term goals are established. A mentor team is assigned to the participant and a plan to reach goals is formulated. The 10-week CWJCGC program may be in addition to other outside resources (i.e. GED classes) that may be secured for the participant. The participant begins to experience the joy of having some control over the course that her life takes right from the start in this program.

Lydia's Closet

Background:

Lydia's Closet is a non-profit professional clothing closet operating under the organizational umbrella of the Christian Women's Job Corps of Greater Columbus (CWJCGC). After two years of planning, television & radio on-air personality, Francine Foster saw her vision manifest when Lydia's Closet opened in August 2006. Although Columbus has other clothing banks, Lydia's Closet specializes in offering its clients clothing suitable for the work environment. Initially, our sole purpose was to provide interview suits for CWJCGC participants upon graduation. However, due to the overwhelmingly generous response of women in the Tri-City area, our donations quickly outweighed the need of the participants and we decided to open the closet to any woman in need of suitable clothing to wear during her job search.

The operating hours are currently by appointment only. However, we plan to expand operations and establish regular hours of operation. The increased population of the Columbus area due to the recent surge in residential relocations from the Gulf Coast after Hurricane Katrina to Ft. Benning's BRAC expansions makes the closet a necessity for our community. Due to the high demand, it is critical that we adhere to the basic guidelines for donations, which help us provide quality, up to date clothing that is ready-to-wear right off the rack.

HISTORICAL REFERENCE

Lydia's closet was named for Lydia of Thyatira in the Bible (Acts 16:11). Lydia of Thyatira was a successful business owner, a seller of purple. She was Greek by birth, but a Jew in religion. Her hometown was one of the important headquarters of the famous dye works, which held a secret formula for making the exquisite purple and scarlet dyes used for the robes of kings and princes. Lydia had made such a success of her new venture that she was an identified leader in the city. In addition to her role in the business community, she took her desire to follow the Christian faith very seriously. She eventually became a leader of a prayer group, the only religious meeting for women recorded in the New Testament. She opened her doors to strangers and continued to share her faith with the people who came to purchase her cloth. Lydia's servant leadership and earnest guidance are qualities Lydia's Closet hopes to convey to everyone that comes through the doors for assistance.

The new location in the Mission Columbus Outreach Center (3579 Steam Mill Road Columbus, GA) is the perfect facility for this ministry.
